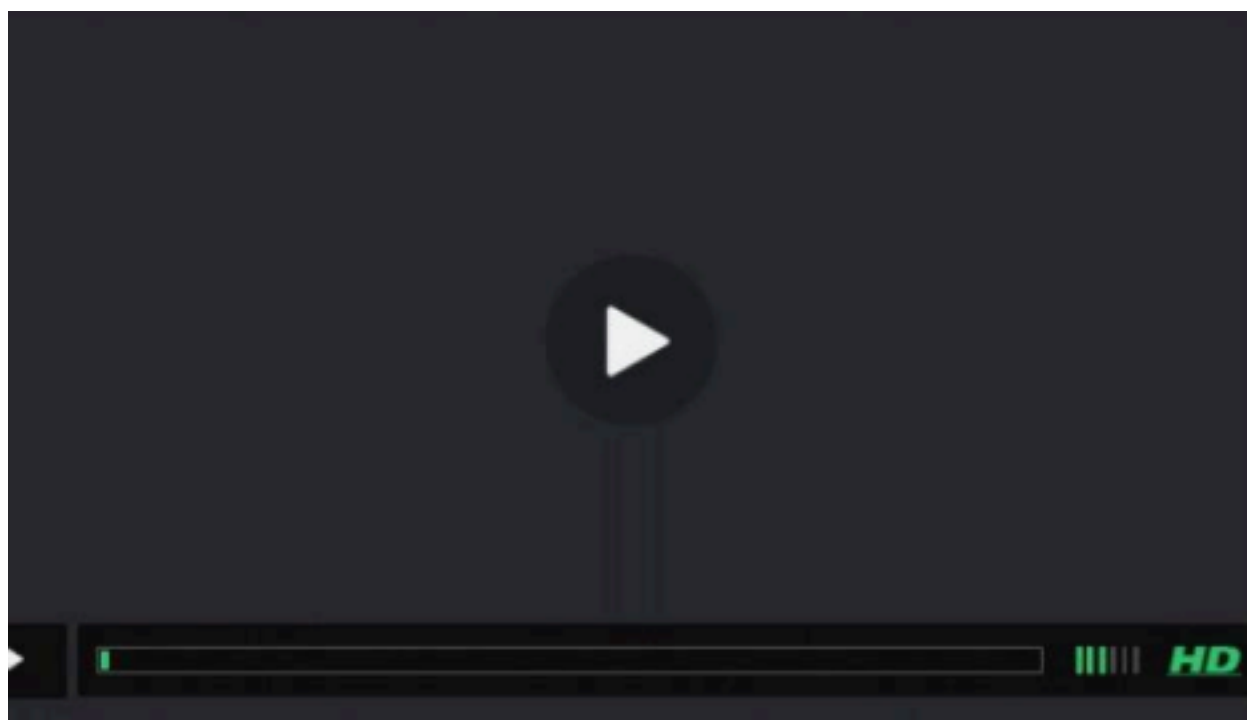

Arkansas to Face Florida in 2026 SEC Tournament Final After Dramatic Semifinal Saturday

NASHVILLE, TN — The stage is set for a heavyweight clash at Bridgestone Arena. Following a day of intense semifinal action, the **No. 3 seed Arkansas Razorbacks** and the **No. 1**

seed Florida Gators have punched their tickets to the 2026 SEC Tournament Championship game.

The Razorbacks End the Cinderella Run

The biggest story of the week came to an end as Arkansas defeated the tournament's ultimate underdog, the **No. 15 seed Ole Miss Rebels**, with a **84-78** victory.

Ole Miss had shocked the college basketball world by winning three games in three days, including a buzzer-beating upset over No. 2 Alabama in the quarterfinals. However, they couldn't find an answer for Arkansas's star guard **Darius Acuff Jr.**, who followed up his 37-point quarterfinal performance with another dominant display. Arkansas used an 8-0 run in the final minutes to pull away and end the Rebels' hope for an automatic NCAA bid.

Florida Cruises Past Vanderbilt

In the earlier semifinal, the **Florida Gators** continued their march toward a potential No. 1 seed in the NCAA Tournament. Facing the **No. 4 seed Vanderbilt**, Florida relied on its interior defense and the double-double performance of forward **Alex Condon**. The Gators secured a comfortable **71-63** win, marking their 13th consecutive victory. Head coach Todd Golden's squad has now reached the SEC title game in three consecutive seasons.
